



### Investment by Chinese Super League sides






Chinese Super League sides have invested 132m€ in player signings, 66% less than last year. It's the 1<sup>st</sup> time the investment decreases in 7 years.





#### Winter window expenditure by league






Chinese Super League sides have invested more than 3 of the top 5 European Leagues this winter (Bundesliga, Ligue1 and Serie A). Winter transfer window is the first of the season in China, which goes from January to December.





#### Top 10 signings Chinese Super League 2017/18





Top 10 most expensive signings ranking do not include any Chinese player, while last week 4 of them were Chinese. The 5 most expensive transfers come from LaLiga.





# Top 10 signings Chinese Super League + Europe Winter 2018





Bakambu and Carrasco's signings are included in the Top 10 China + Europe most expensive signings in the winter window. Last season, 5 Chinese Super League players were included in the Top 10.






#### Investment in signings by team








## Participation of players signed in winter 2016/17






44 out of 93 players (47%) signed last Winter participated in more tan half of the minutes of the Chinese Super League.

#### Participation of top 10 signings 2016/17- Chinese Super League






Zhang has become the most profitable player in terms of minutes played from the Top 10 most expensive players last winter. The only one beyond the 60% of the minutes is Brown Ideye, due to the sanction implemented by the Chinese Federation on him during the 2<sup>nd</sup> half of the league.





## Winter player sales income trend - Chinese Super League










## Player Sales Value by team - Chinese Super League
