- Data included refer to main divisions of top 5 European leagues (LaLiga Santander, Premier League, Serie A, Bundesliga and Ligue 1)
- Transfer data only include fix amounts.
- Year to year comparisons refer to winter market only, unless otherwise indicated
- Includes transfers that took place until February 1st 2017
- Transfer figures are gross of commissions or revenue share with other stake holders
- Sign-up means new player arrivals (not total number of registered players) and Exits players leaving the team (even if on loan)
- On going season review and European Football Table have been produced mainly with 1st half of the season at top 5 European leagues (except where otherwise indicated)
- Sales of players (or stakes of economics rights) to investment funds are not considered by the report
- Matches postponed: Valencia C.F. vs. Real Madrid; Bologna vs. Milan; Crotone vs. Juventus

- ✓ Winter transfers activity follows a summer window which showed highest investments ever at most of top 5 European leagues to a 3,2bio€ record combined investment
- ✓ Consolidation of Chinese Super League purchasing power, continuing to target Europe's best players despite new regulations aimed at restricting overseas players signings
- ✓ Real Madrid and Atlético banned from signing players by FIFA
- ✓ Players trading has become standard practice also among top clubs, with sales becoming main income source to finance investment in new players
- ✓ British Sterling currency depreciation following Brexit vote

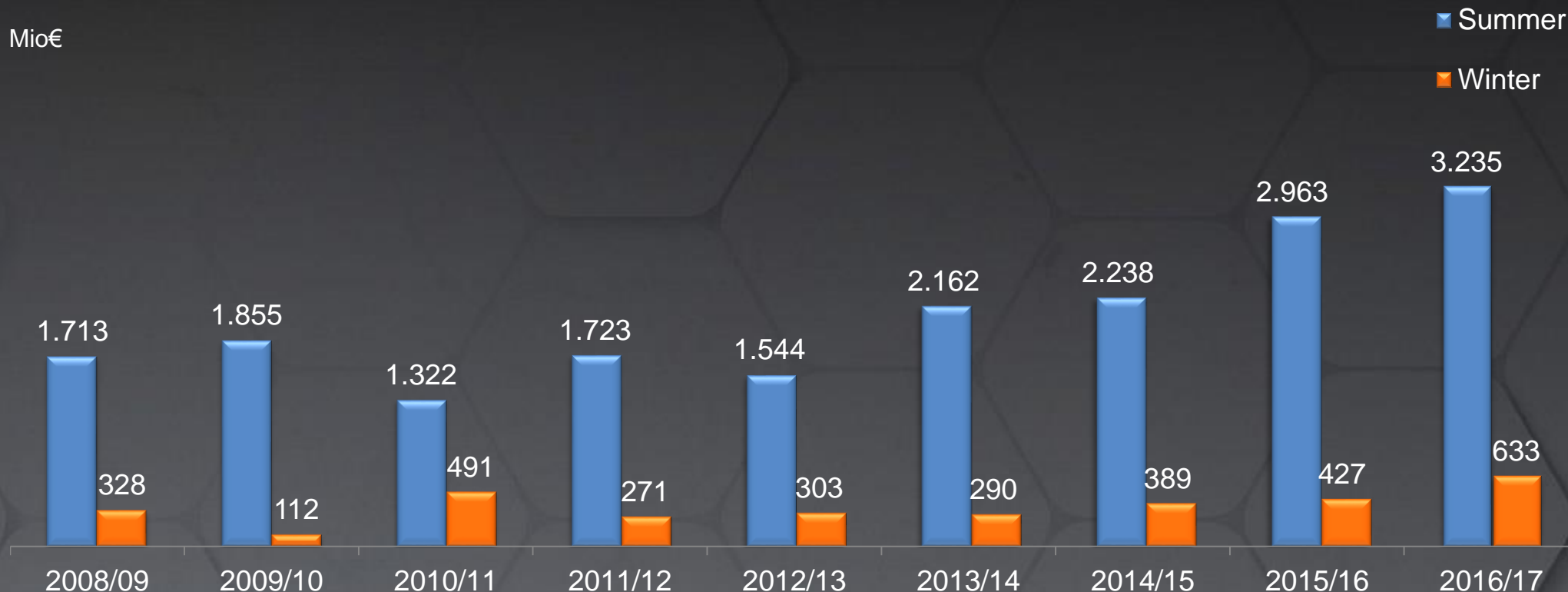

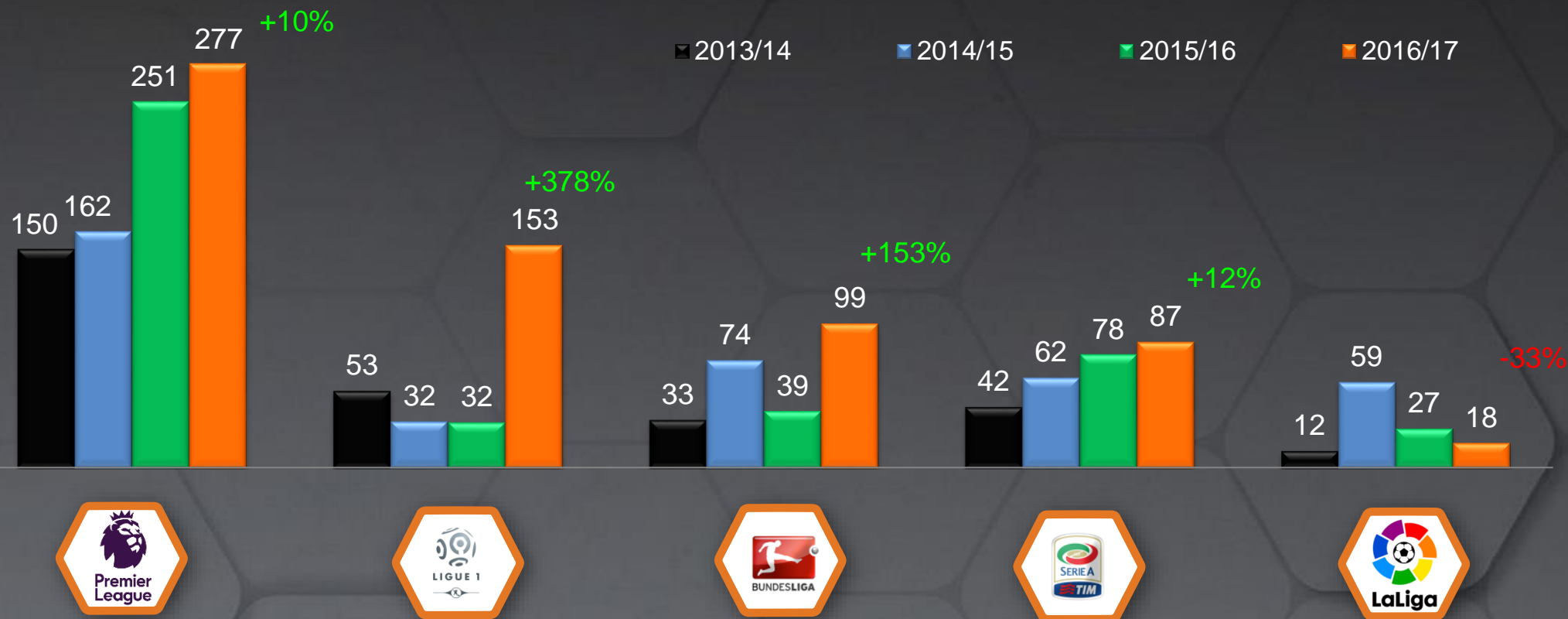

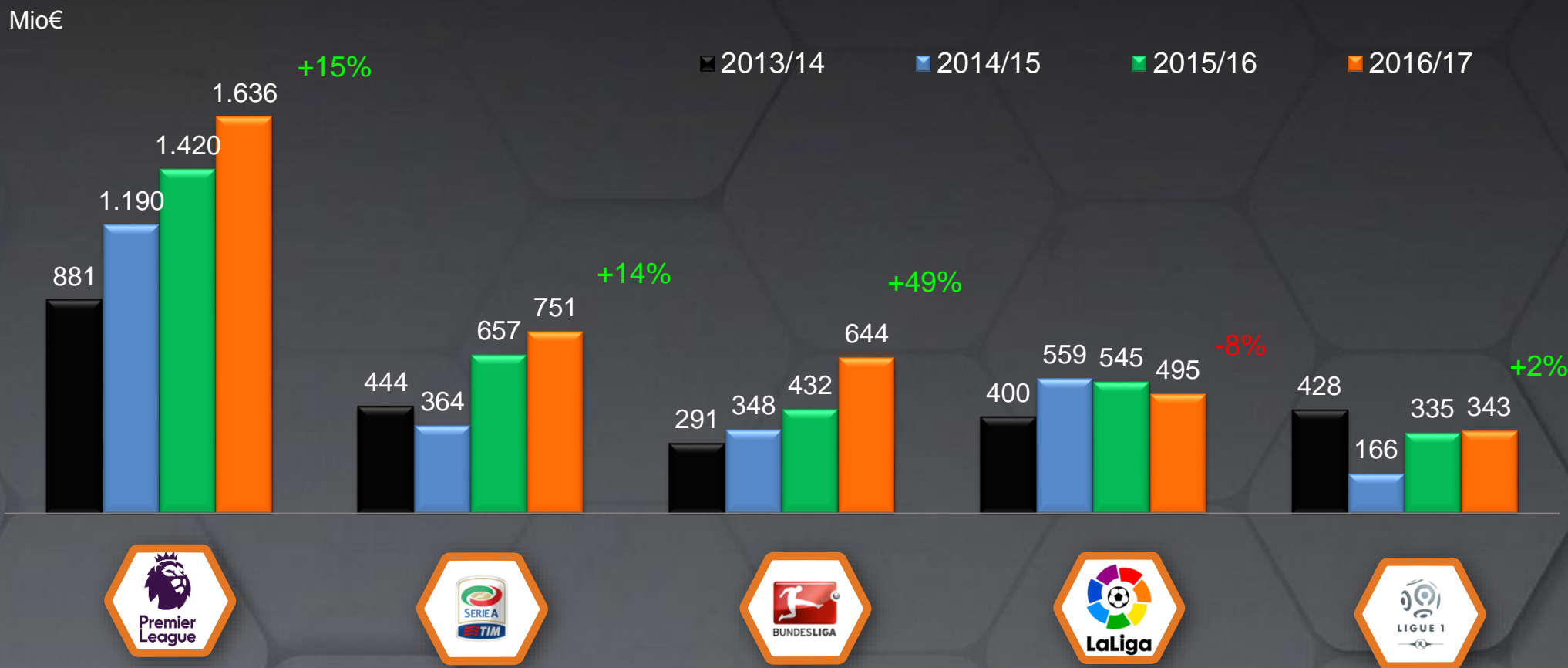
WINTER WINDOW EXPENDITURE BY LEAGUE

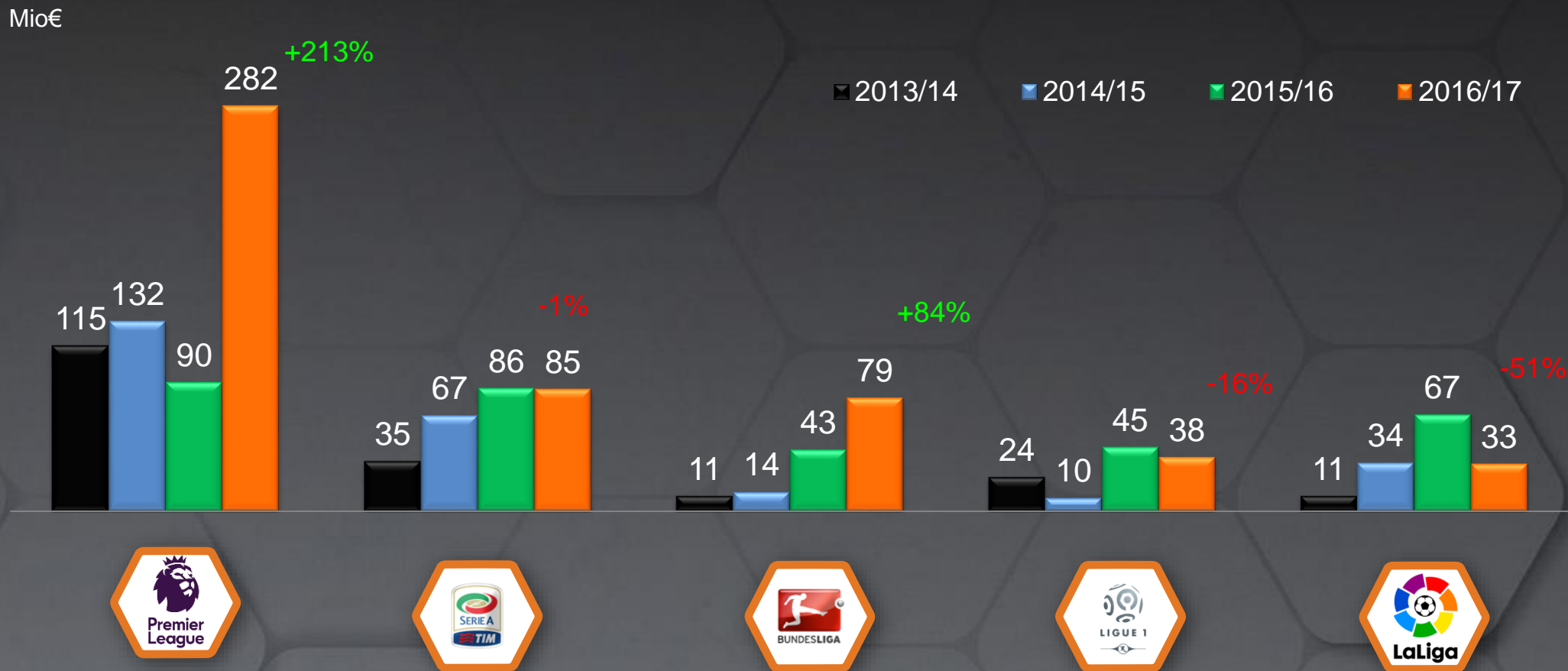
Premier League sides invested 277m€, +10% vs last winter and well ahead any other league. League 1 is the surprise runner-up after almost multiplying investment by 5 to 153mio€. Bundesliga (99) & SerieA (87) follow, while LaLiga sides spent only 18m€

COMBINED SIGNINGS INVESTMENT SUMMER + WINTER TOP 5 EUROPEAN LEAGUES



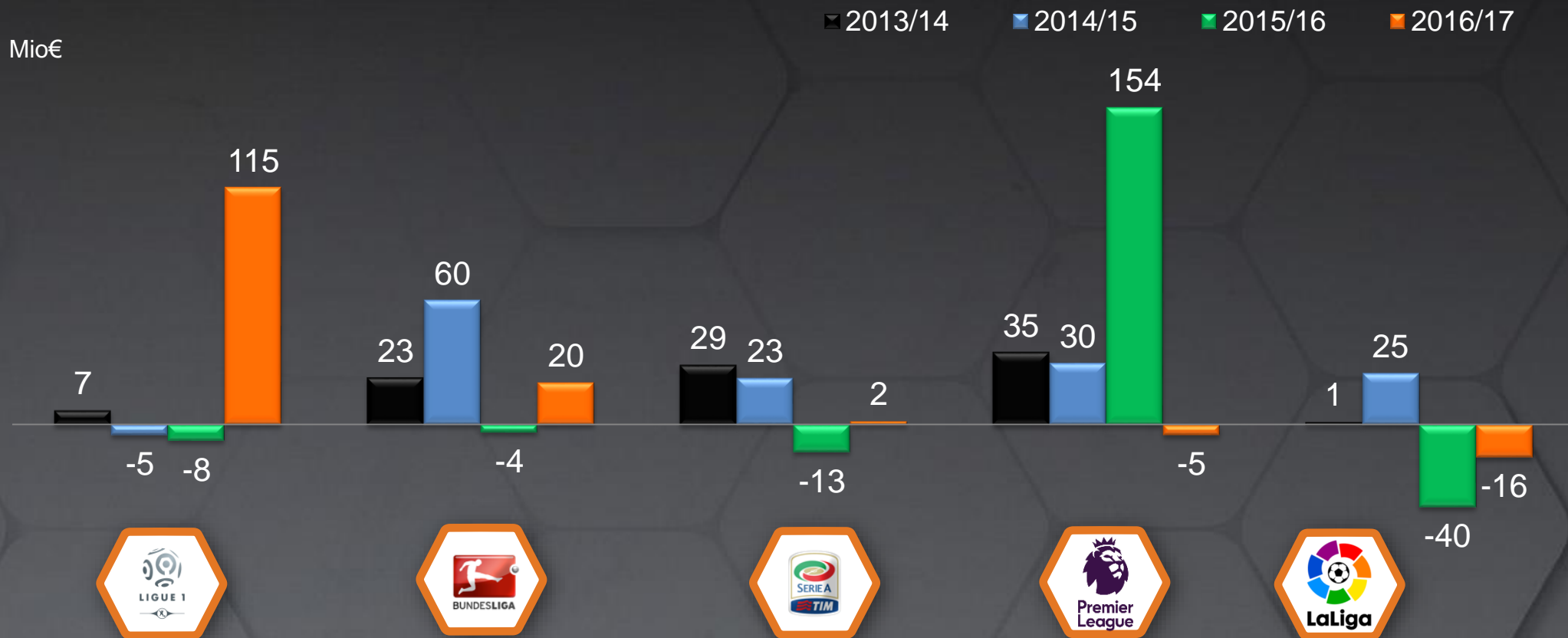
Combined season investment by Premier League clubs was again the highest ever, in excess of 1,6bio€ (+15%). SerieA reached 751m€, followed by Bundesliga (644), LaLiga (495), and Ligue1 (343)

Premier League sides sold players for a whopping 282m€ this winter, more than ever. SerieA (85), Bundesliga (79) complete the top 3. Ligue1 & LaLiga sides only collected 38 & 33m€ for player sales respectively

High profile signings by PSG and investment of Olympique Marseille under new ownership made Ligue1 the strongest in Europe in terms of net investment. Premier League were only 4th, with player sales income 5m€ higher than amount spent (negative net investment)

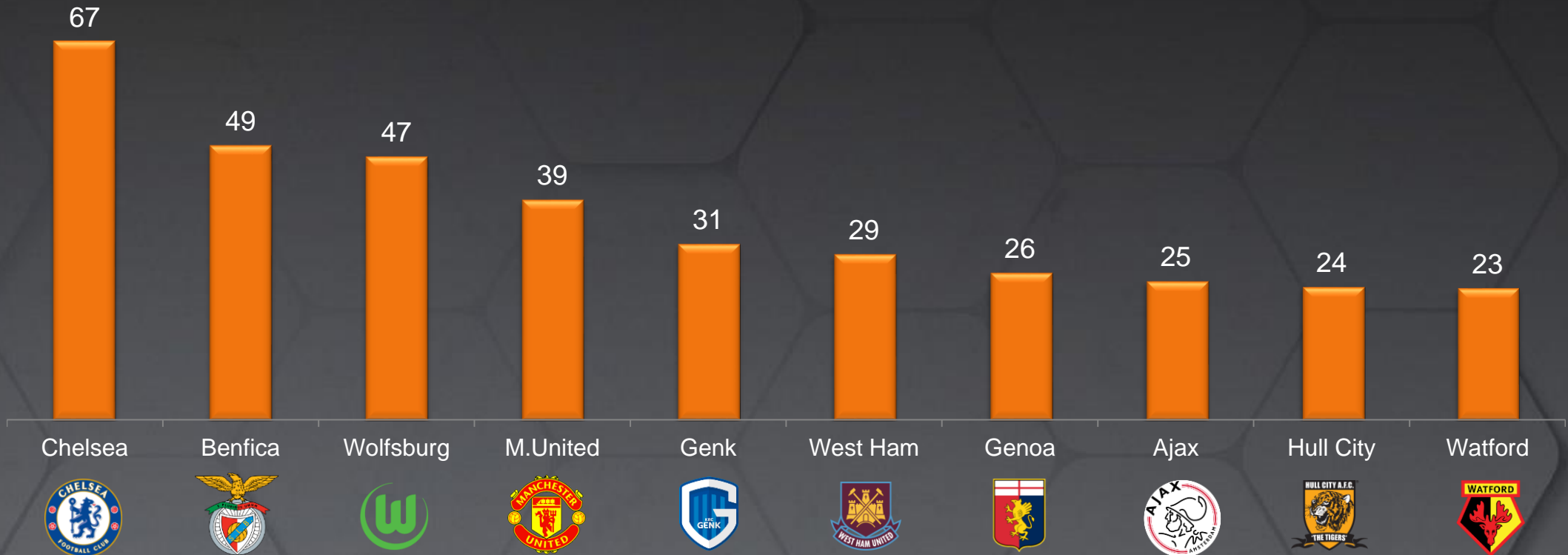
TOP 10 CLUBS WITH HIGHEST INVESTMENT IN EUROPE



PSG aspiration to improve position in the table made them the highest spenders in Europe (70m€), followed by Crystal Palace & Marseille (38m€) in their mission to avoid relegation and play in Europe respectively. Only 5 EPL teams feature in top 10 (vs 7 last year)

For the third time in the last 4 years, Chelsea lead the ranking of player sales income in Europe winter after selling Oscar to Chinese side Shanghai SIPG. Benfica is once again among top teams in income after selling Guedes to PSG. For the first time, 5 EPL sides feature in European top 10 of sales income

TOP 10 MOST EXPENSIVE WINTER SIGNINGS 2016/17



Draxler's signing by PSG for 40m€ is the most expensive in Europe, followed by Manchester City's Gabriel Jesus (32m€) and PSG's Guedes (30). Only 5 out of 10 most expensive signings took place in England (vs 9 last year). 9 of 10 took place either in England or France

TOP 10 MOST EXPENSIVE WINTER SIGNINGS



Draxler signing by PSG and Jesus by Manchester City have joined historical top 10 of most expensive transfers, which is still topped by Fernando Torres move to Chelsea for 58,5mio€ in 2011.

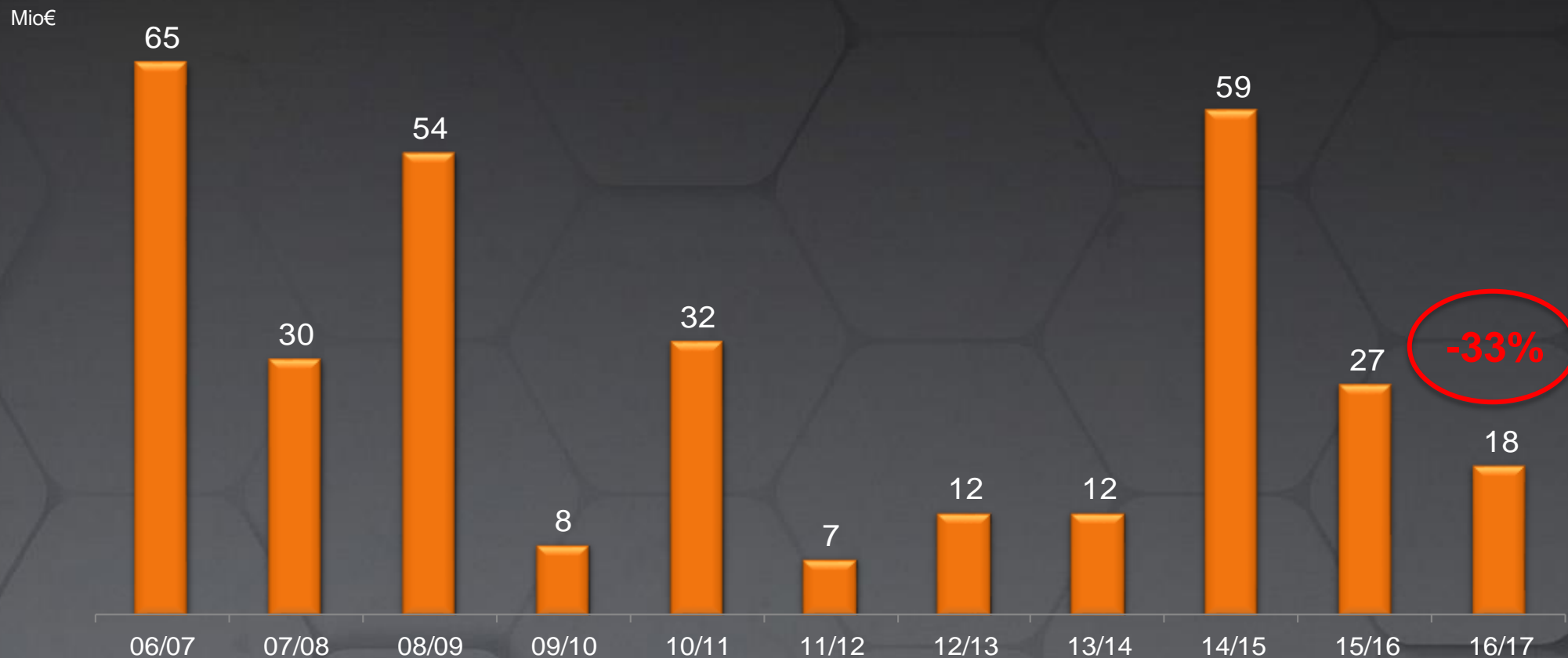

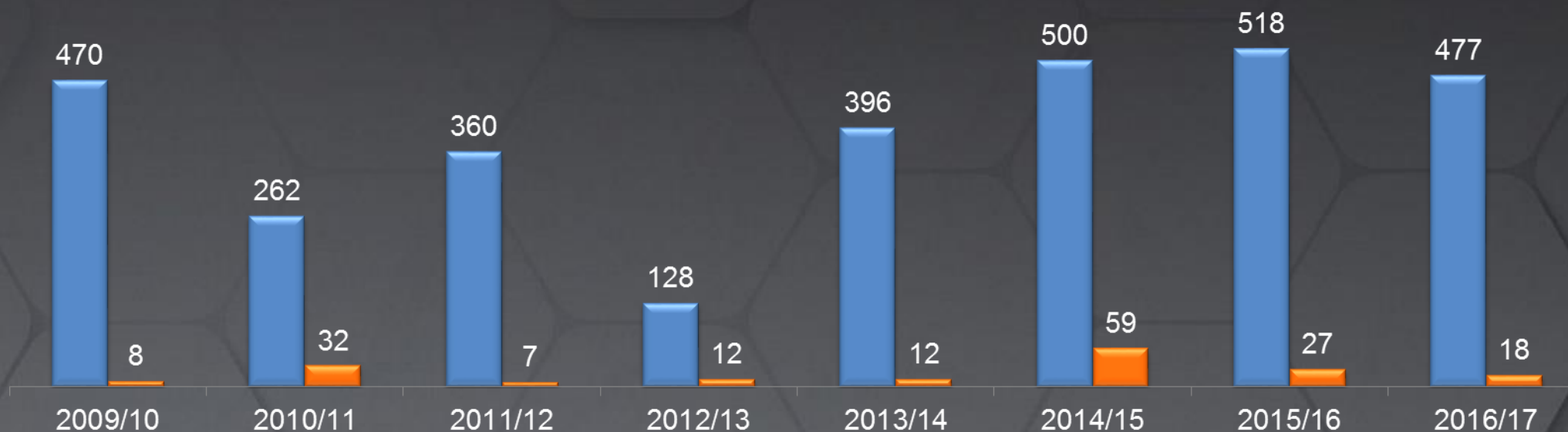


LaLiga sides investment in winter was down 33% to just 18m€, following strong summer activity and lack of transfers by Madrid teams due to FIFA ban

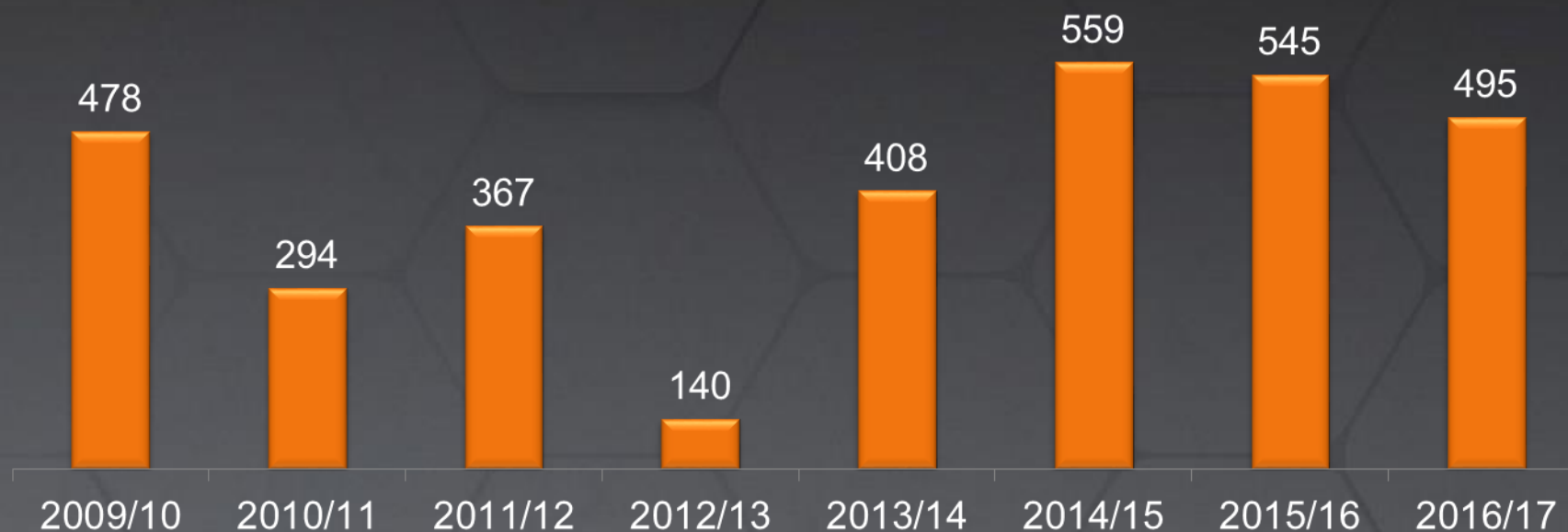

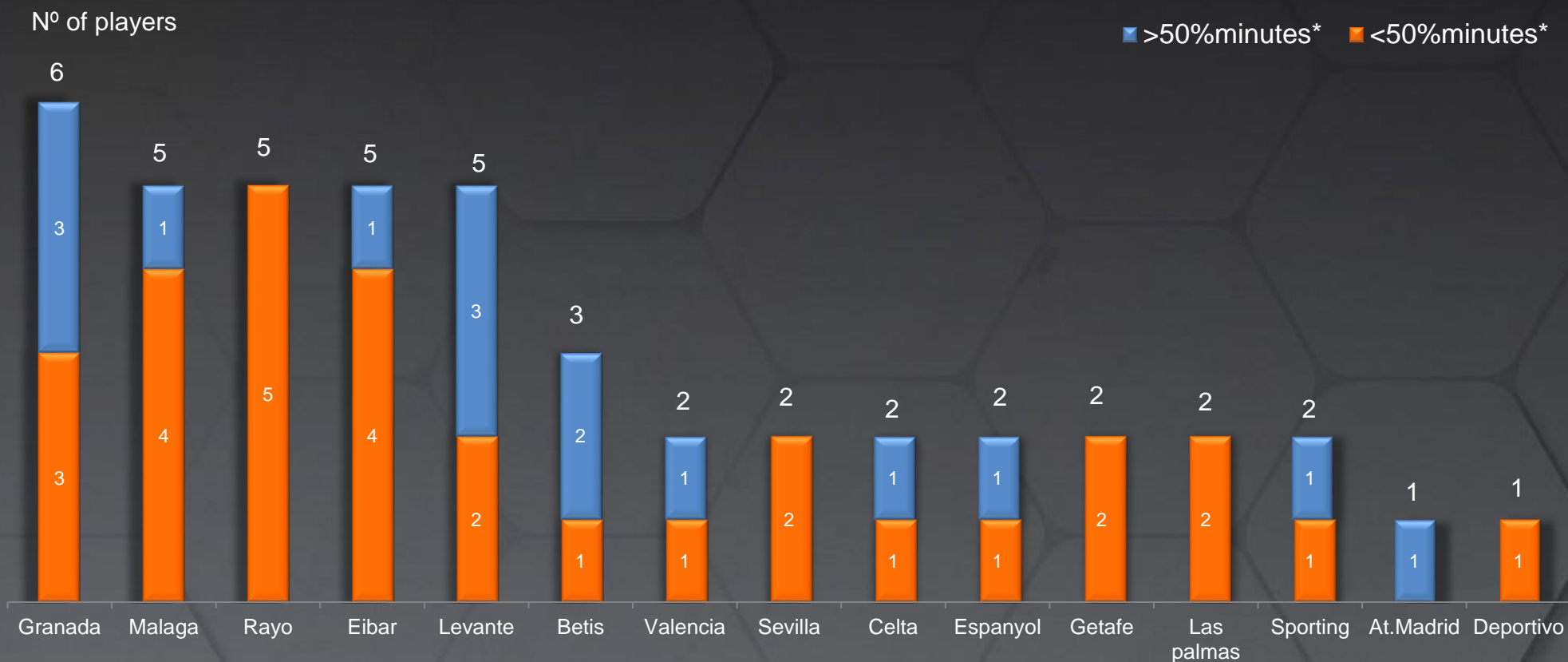

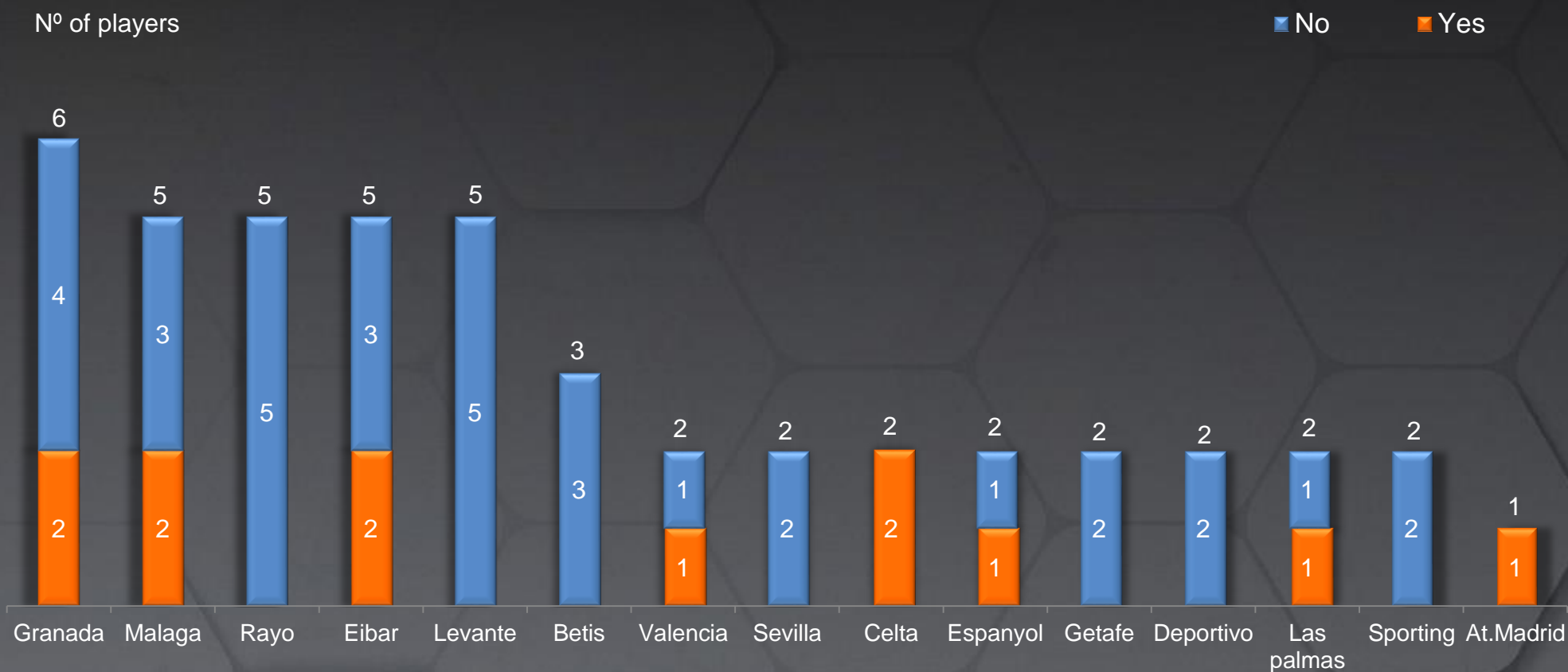

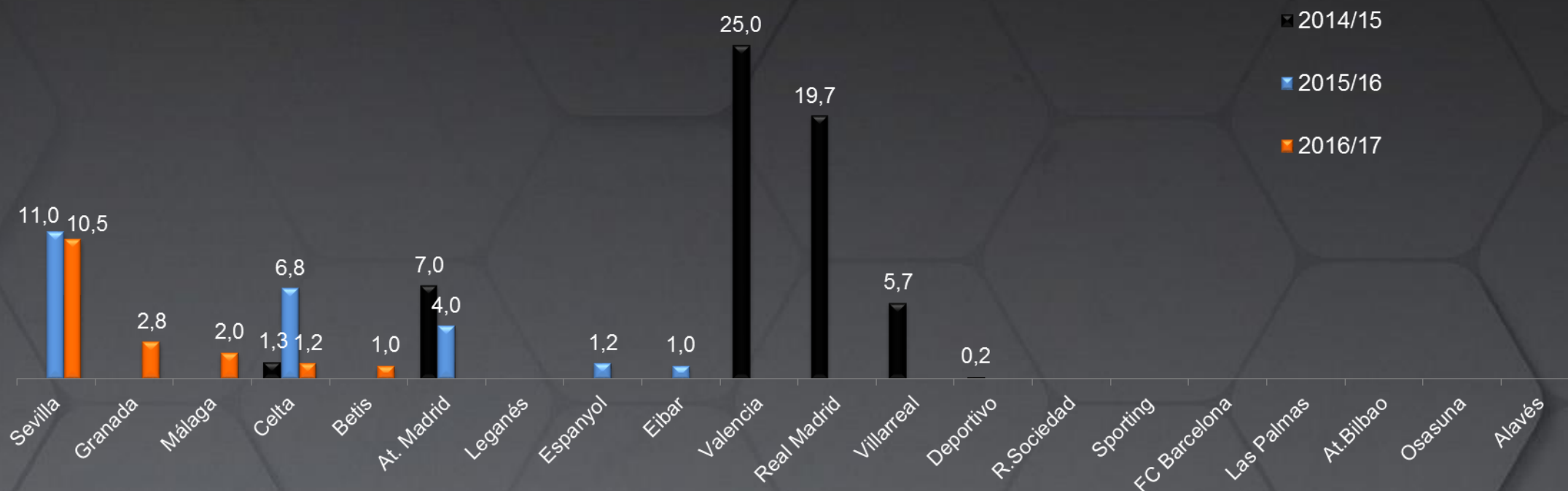
CONTINUITY IN 2016/17 OF PLAYERS SIGNED IN WINTER 2015/16

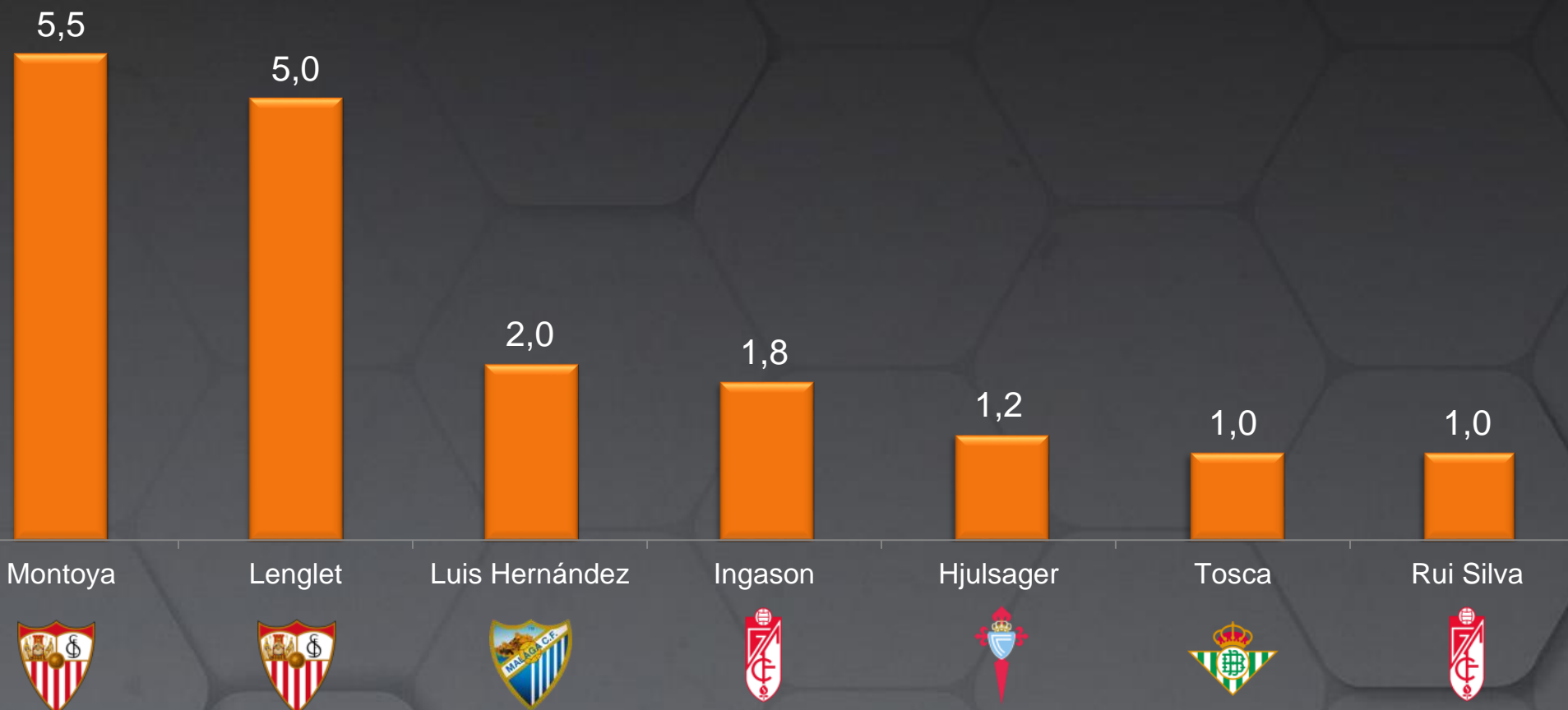

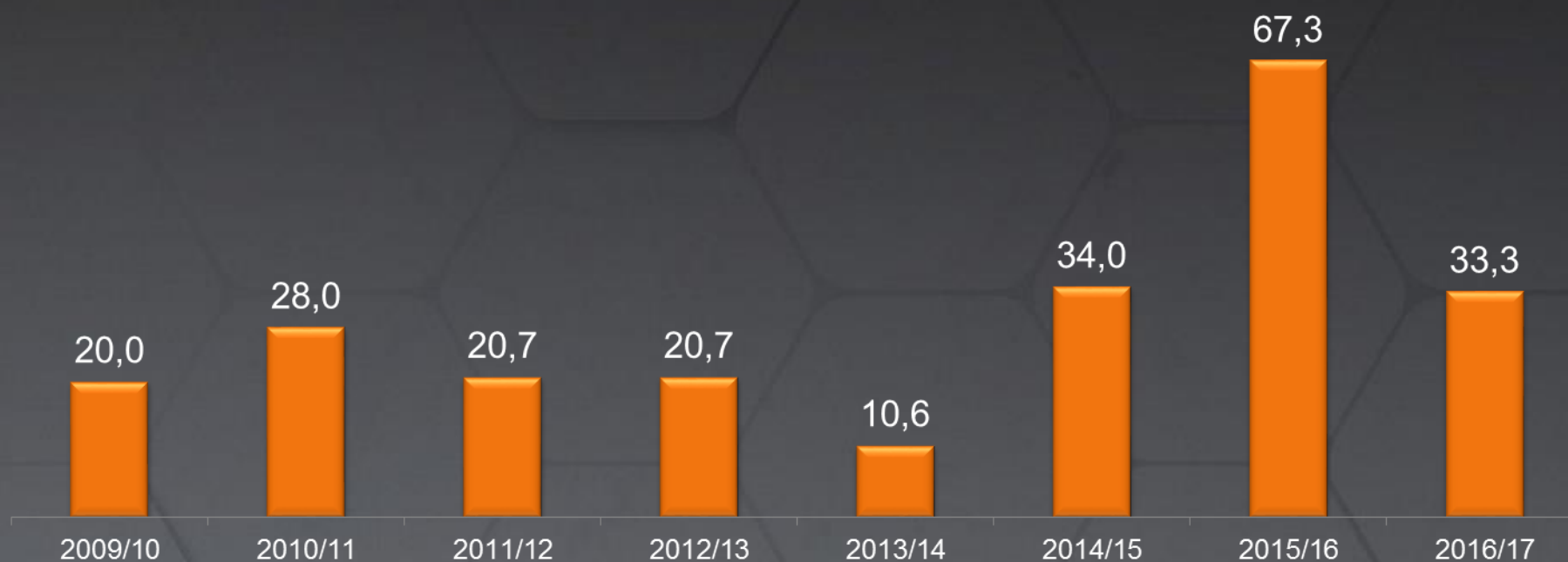

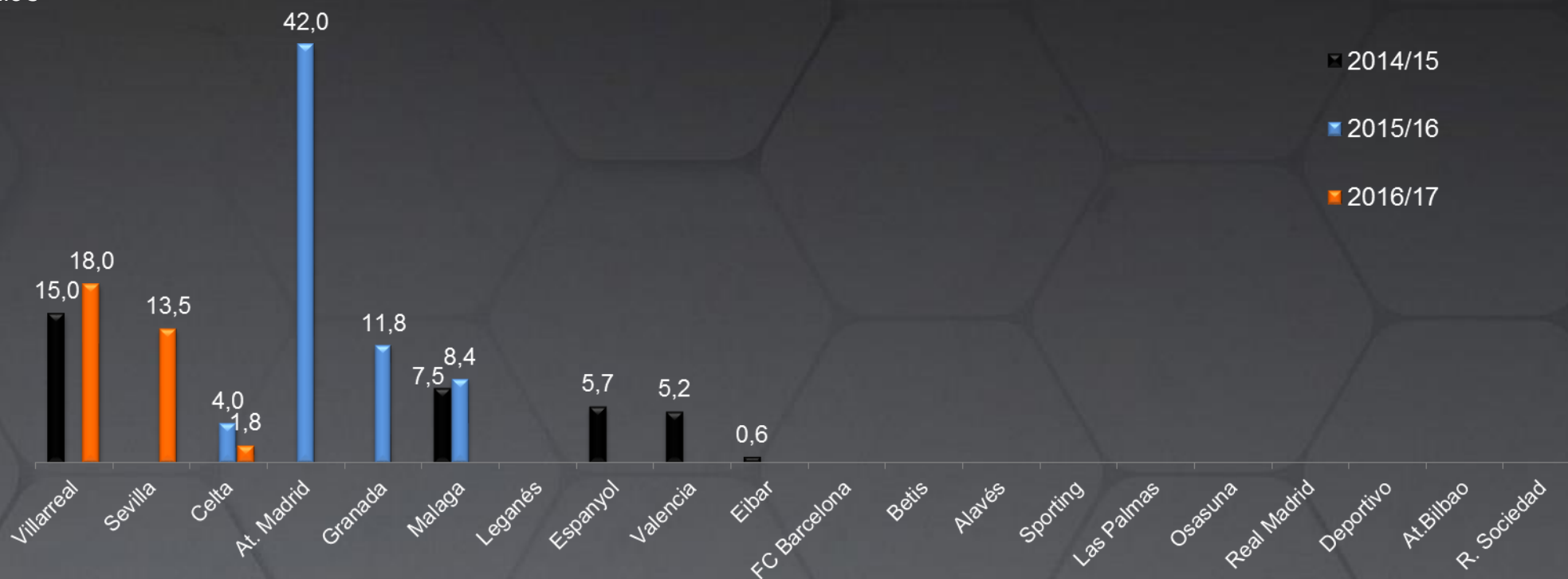

PLAYER SALES VALUE BY TEAM- LALIGA SANTANDER

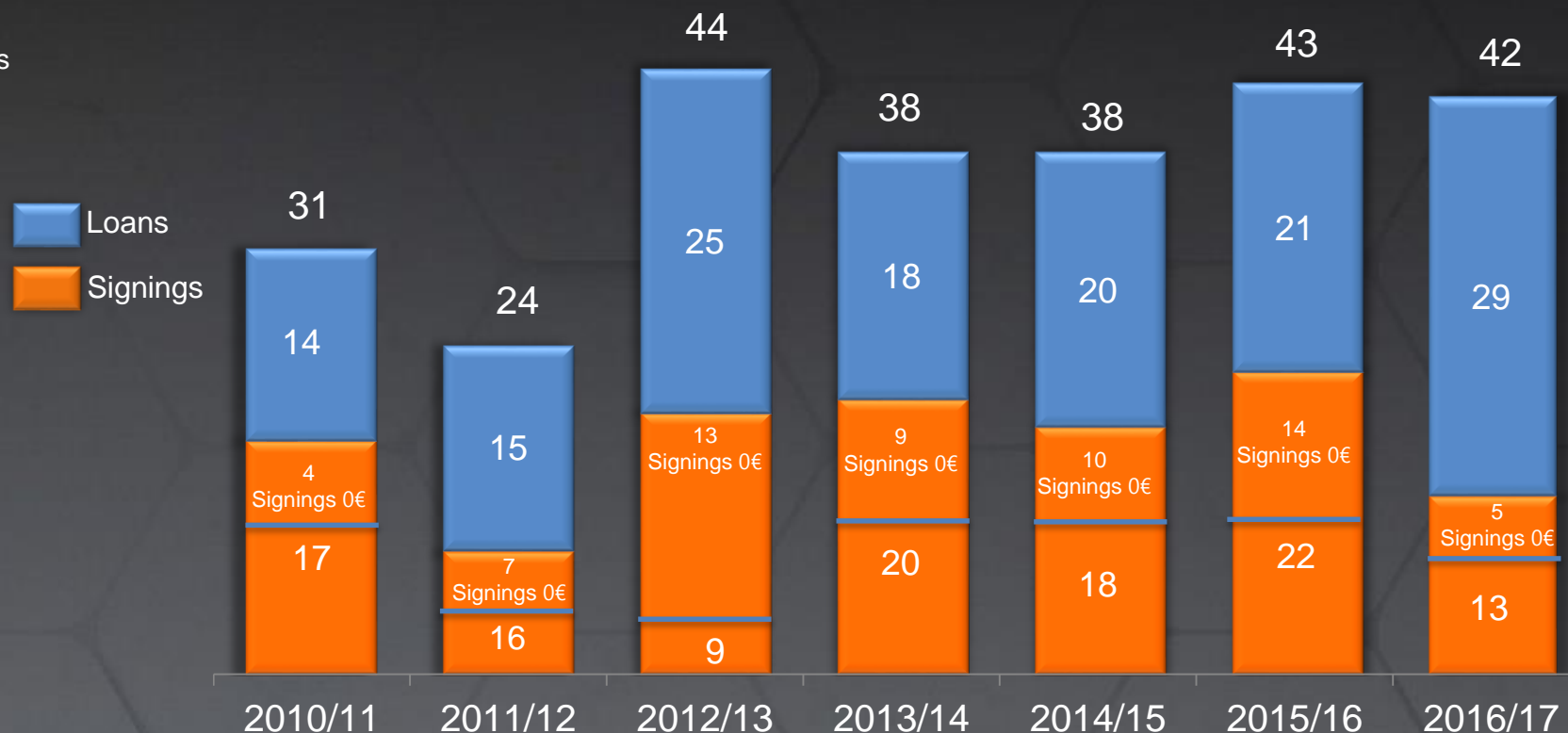

NUMBER OF SIGN-UPS LALIGA SANTANDER

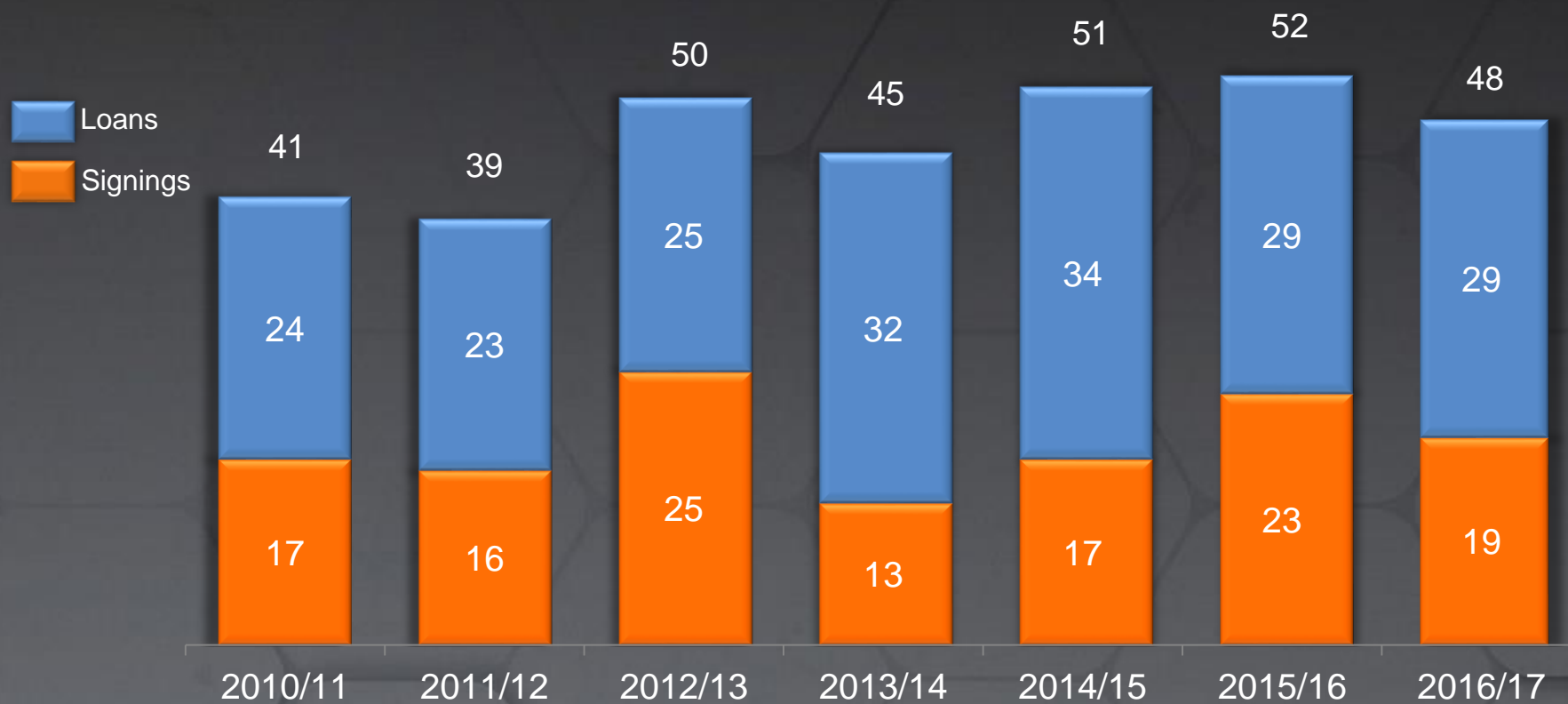

NUMBER OF PLAYER EXITS- LALIGA SANTANDER

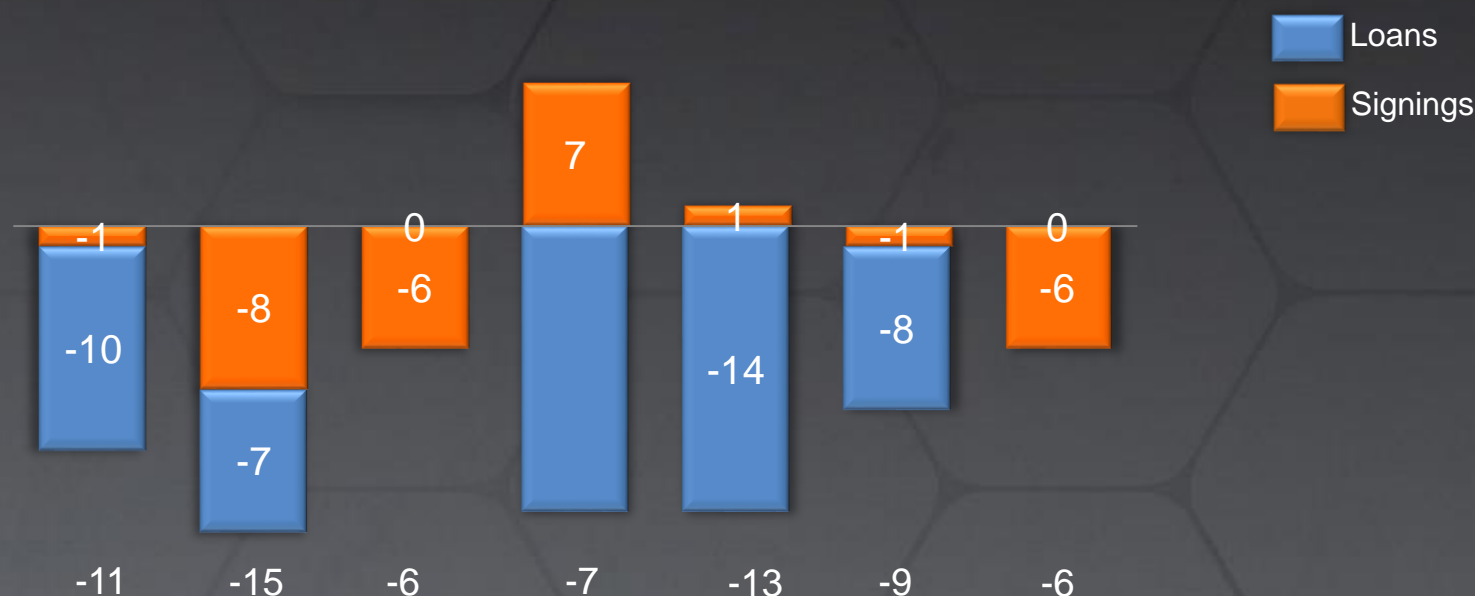

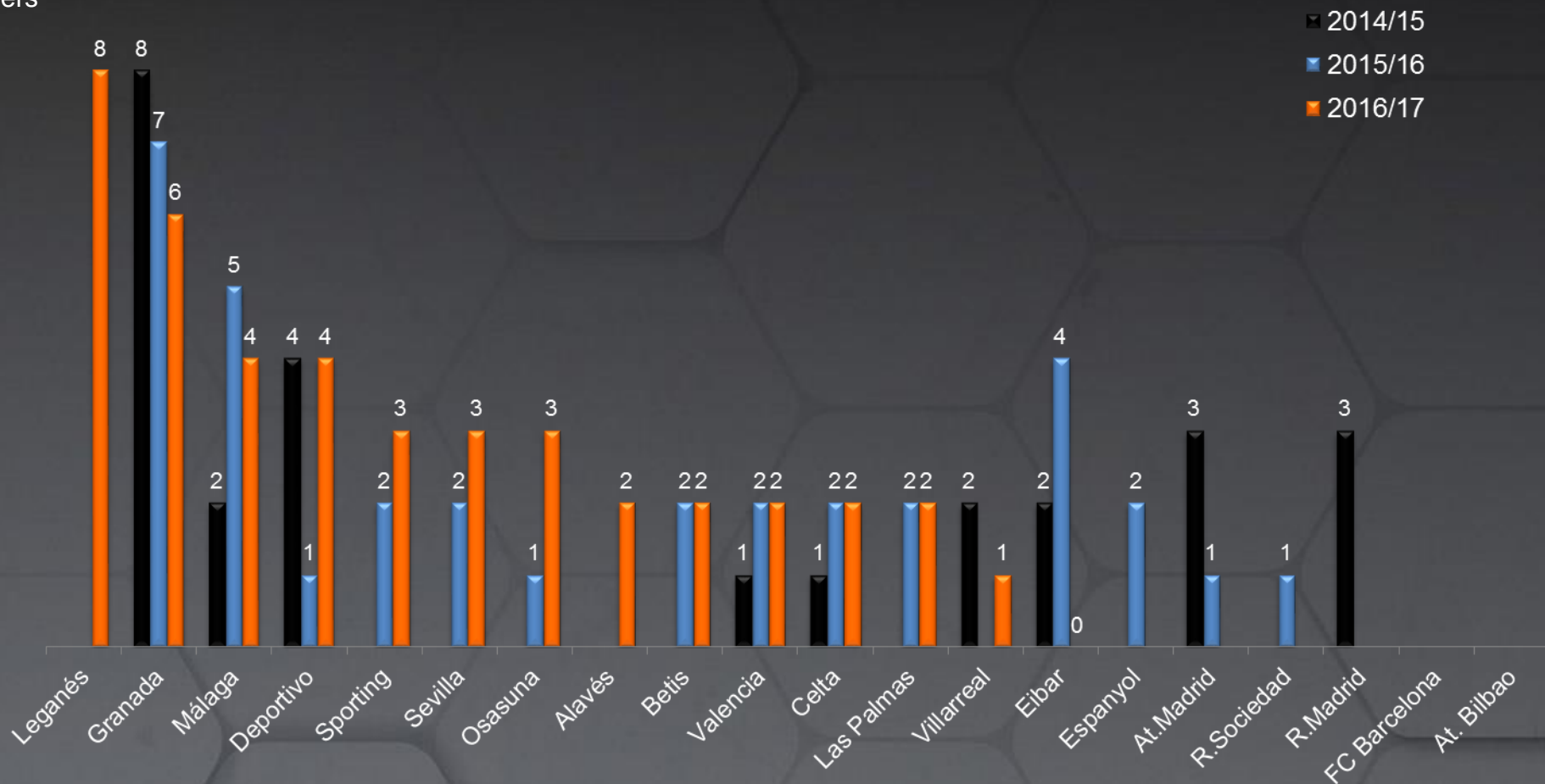

SIGN-UPS BY TEAM- LALIGA SANTANDER

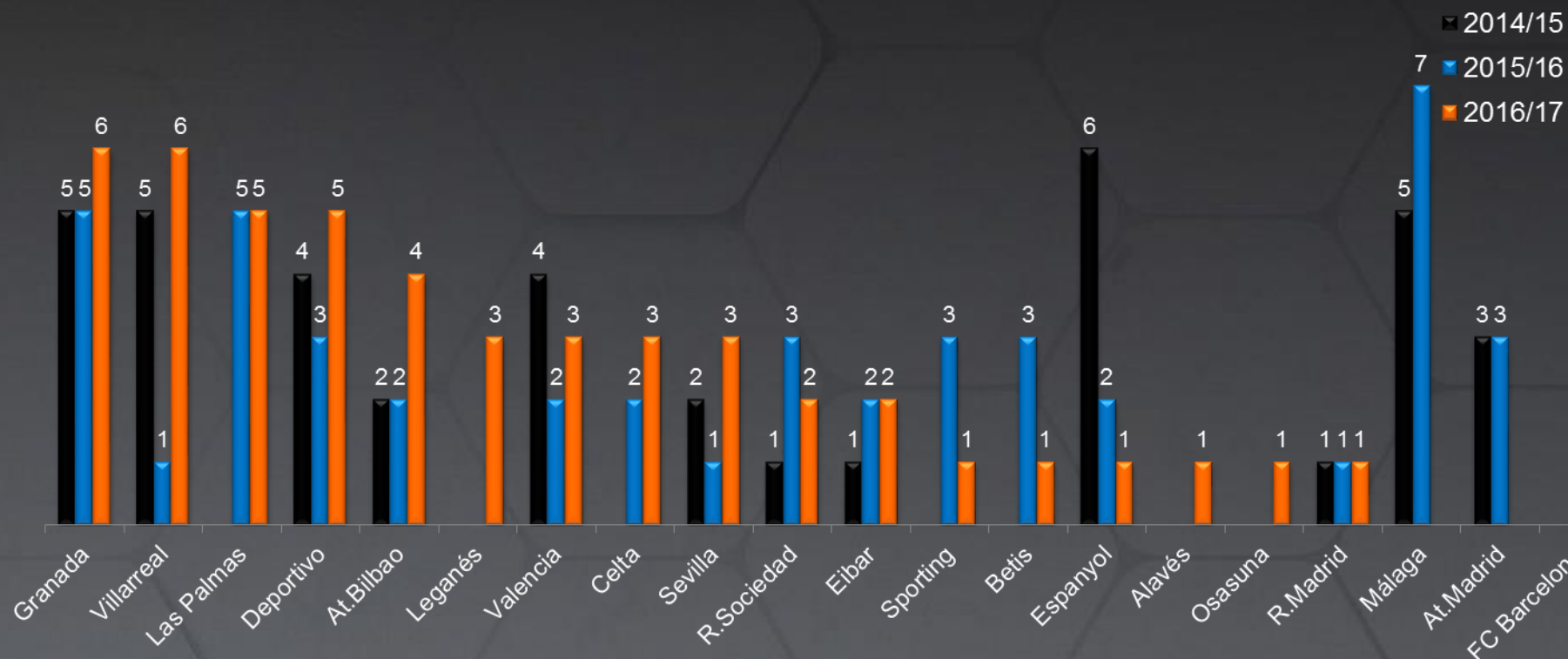

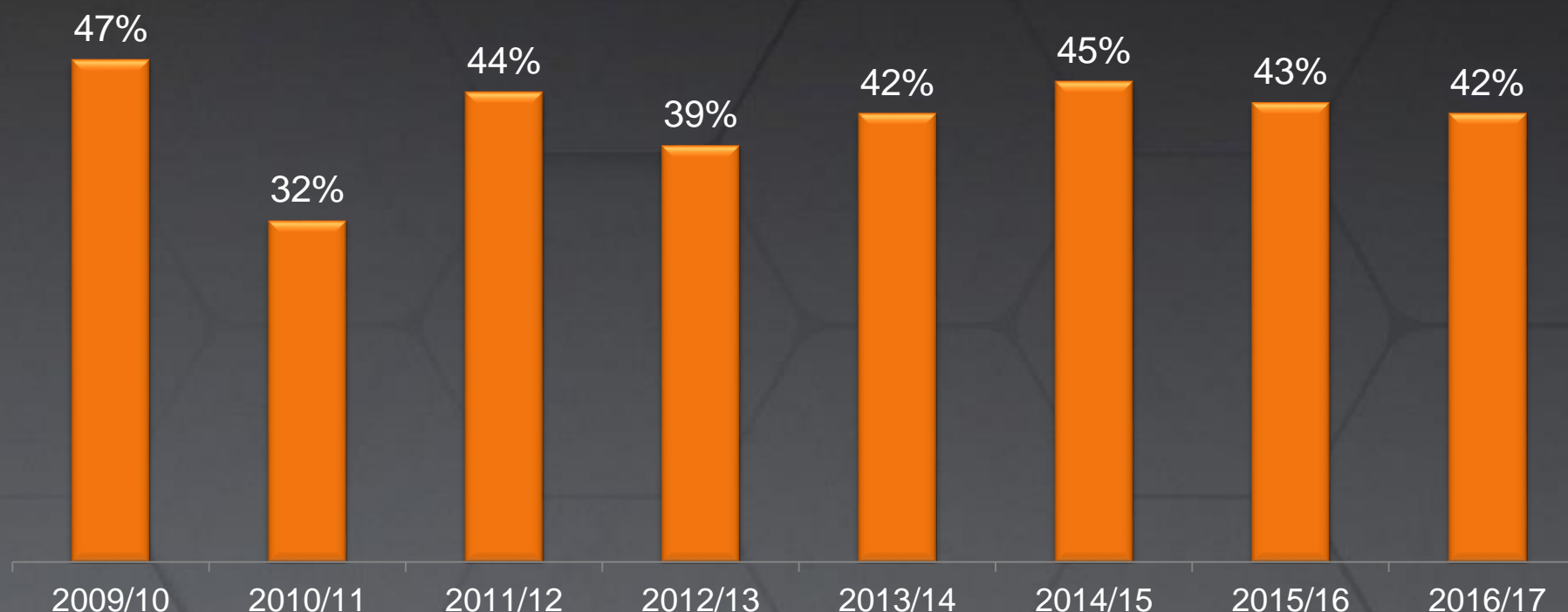

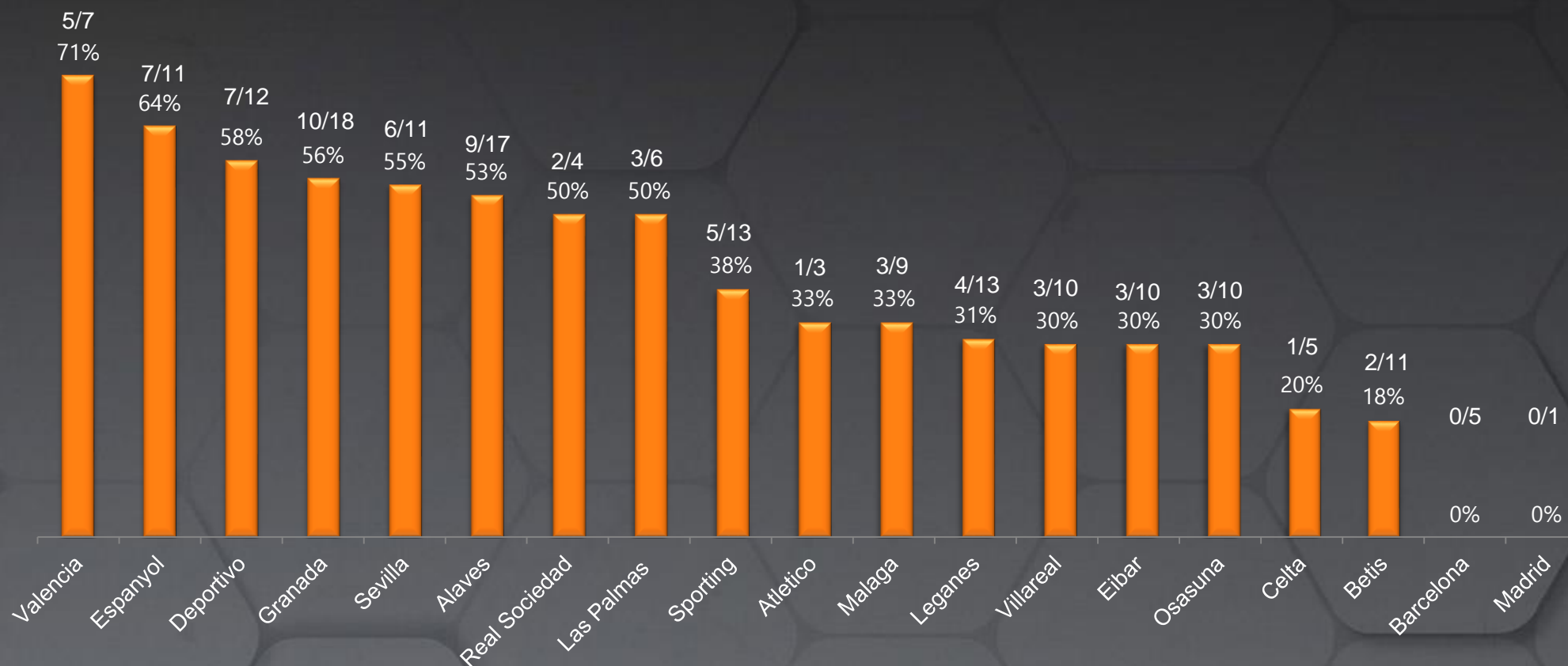


The use of summer signings stays similar to the previous years. 42% of the summer transfers have played more than half of the minutes. One more season the amount does not reach the 50% ratio

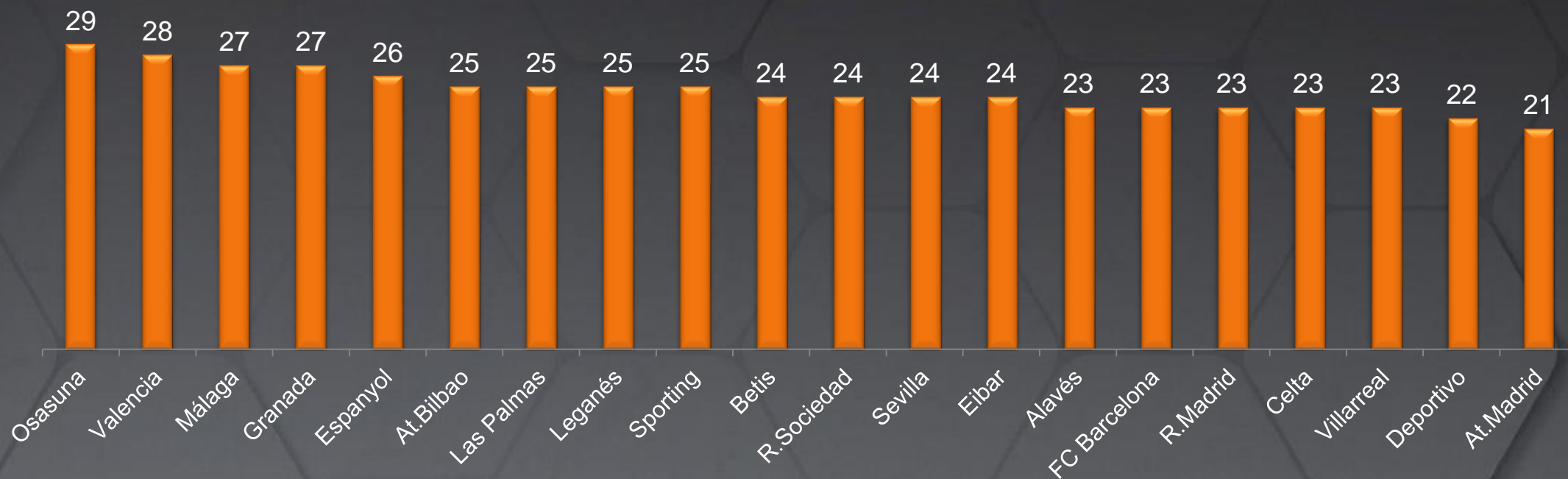

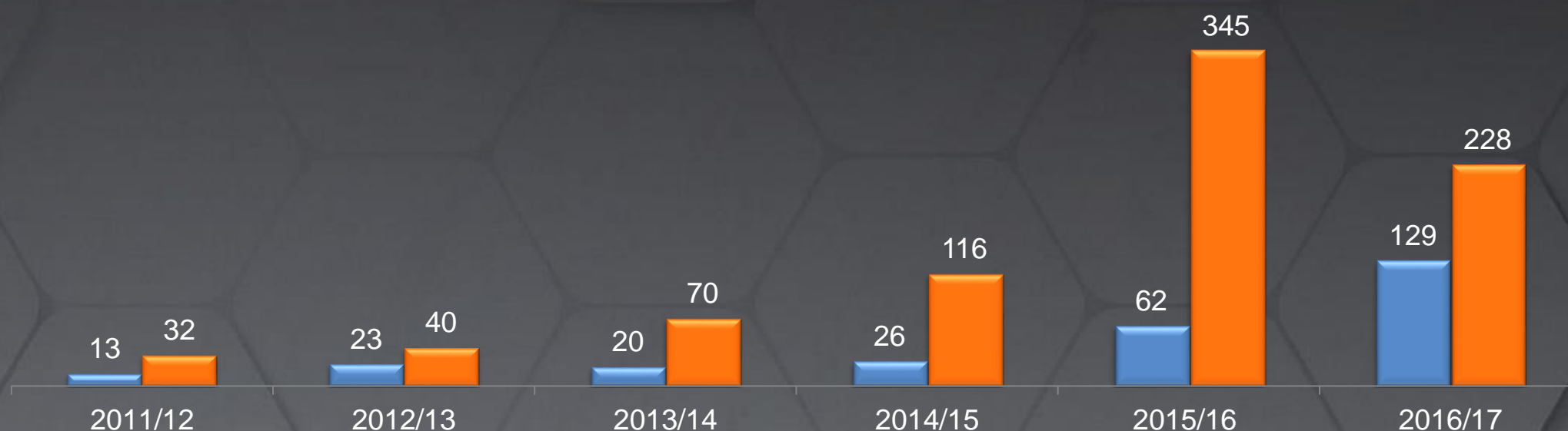

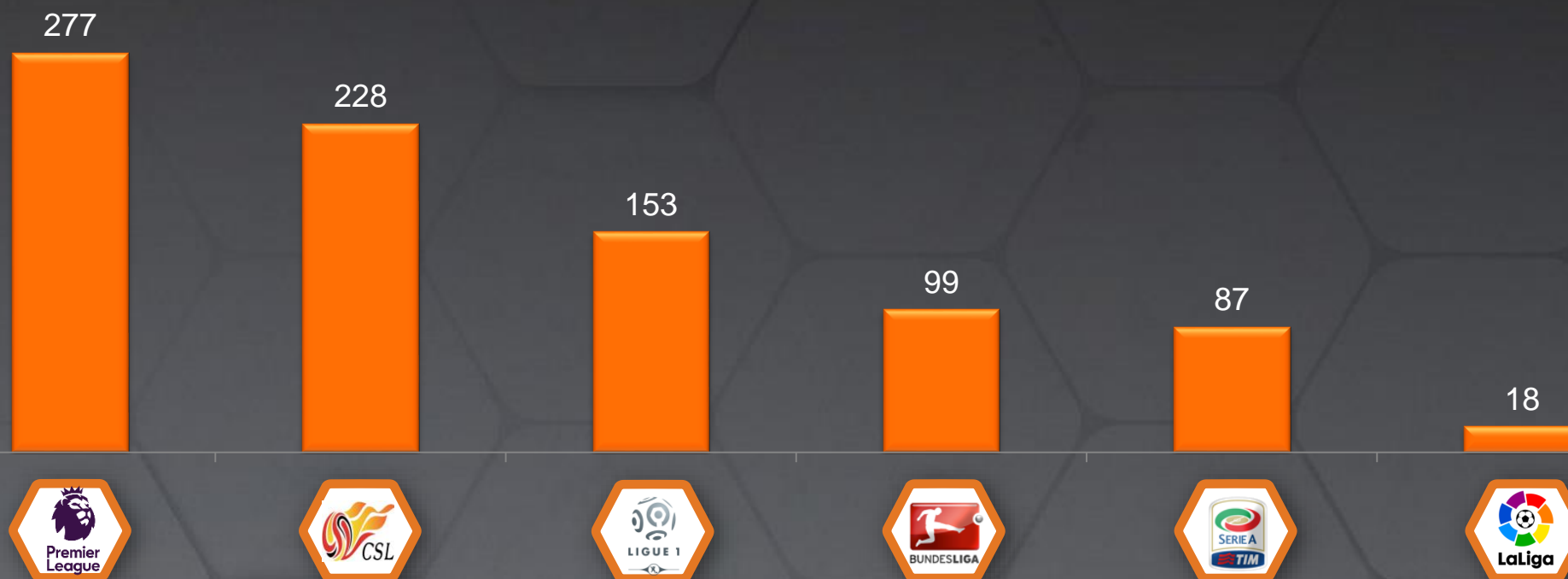


WINTER WINDOW EXPENDITURE BY LEAGUE

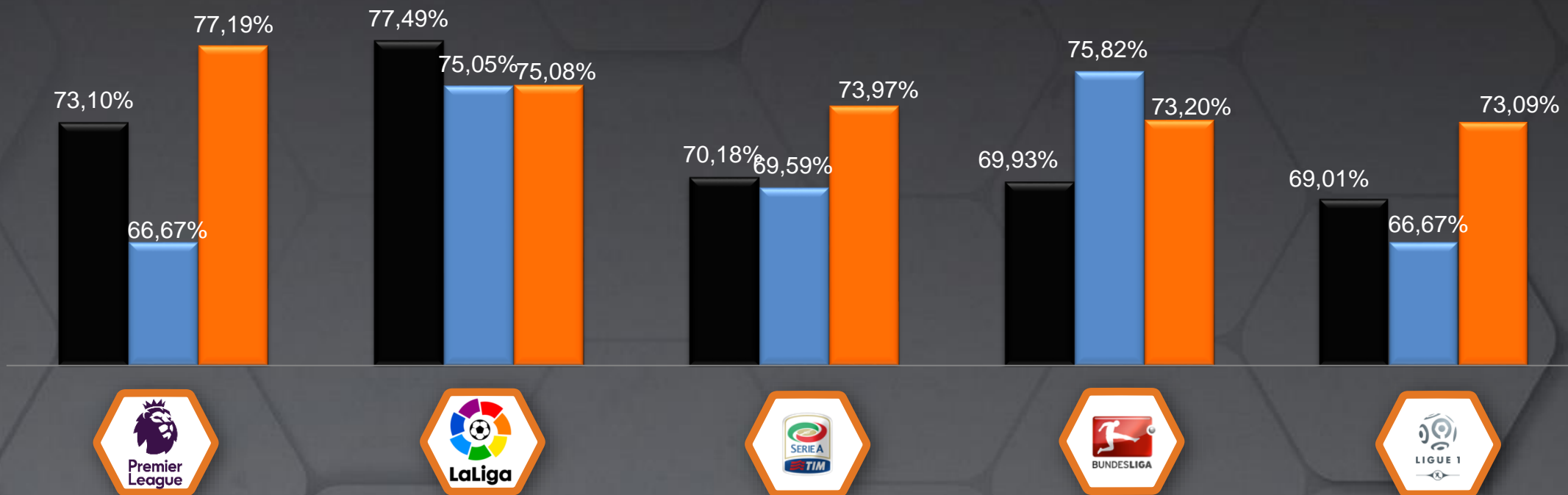

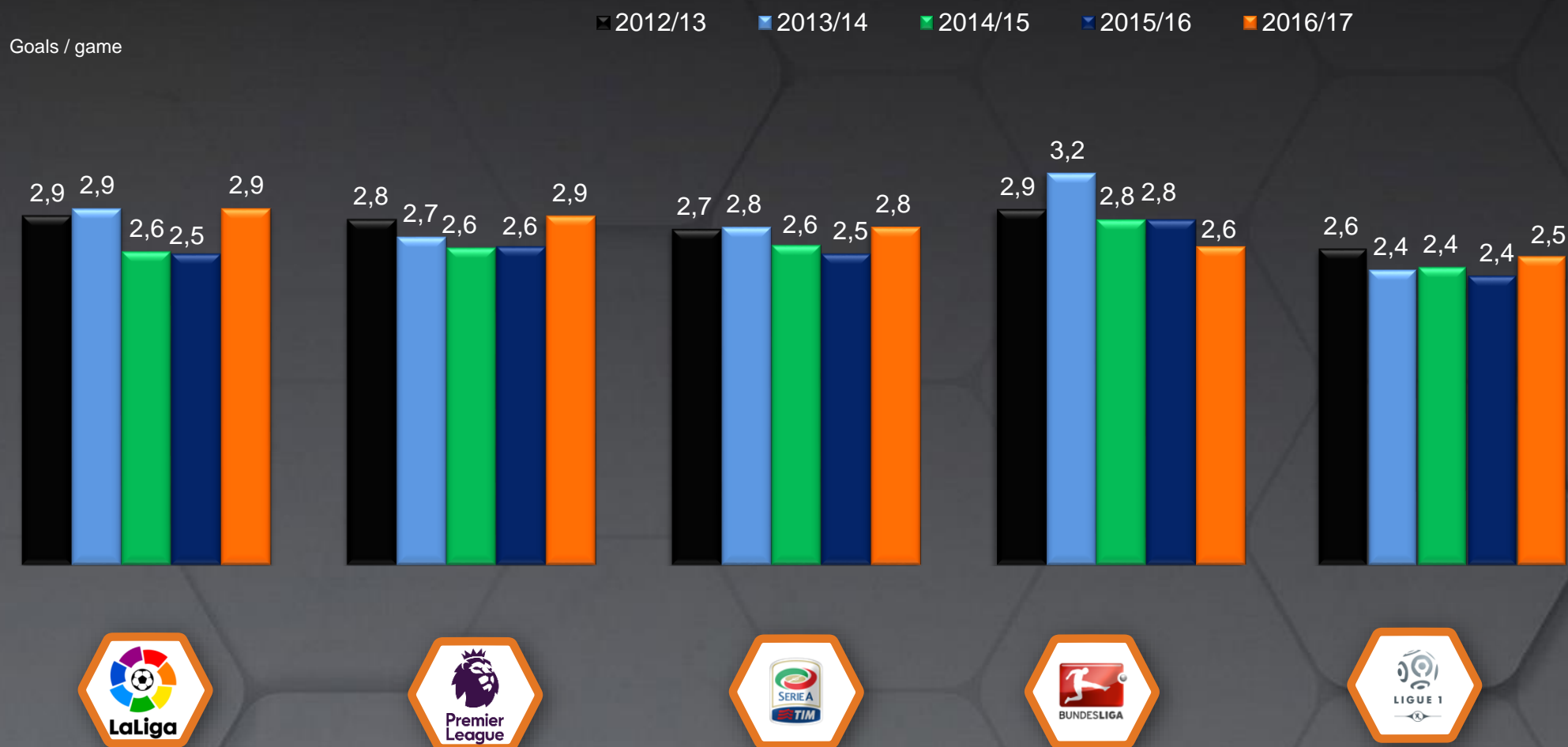

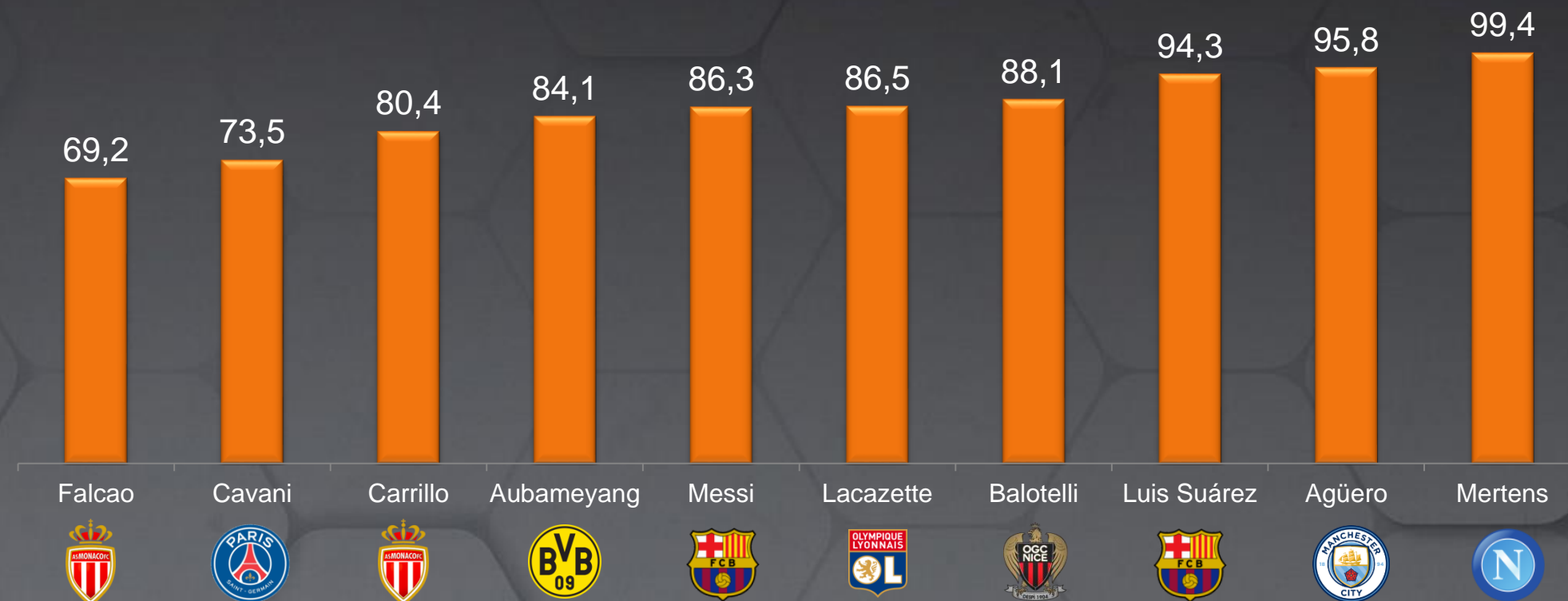

TOP 10 PLAYERS BY GOAL EFFICACY

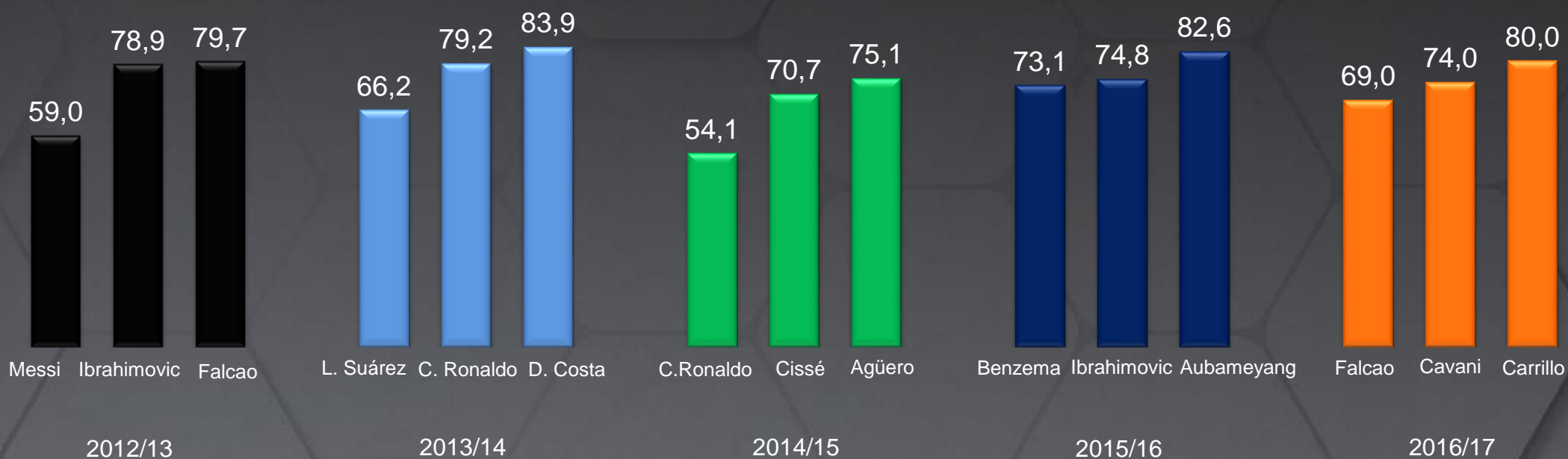

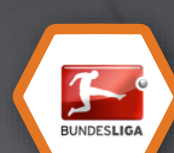

CONCLUSIONS FTR 2017- WINTER (1 OF 4)

- ✓ Top five 5 European Leagues invested 633mio€ in players at winter transfer window, up 48% to highest amount in history and 2nd highest % vs summer
- ✓ Combined investment of summer and winter transfer windows in top 5 European leagues was almost 3,9bio€, up 14% vs last season and again record high ever
- ✓ Premier League sides invested 277m€, +10% vs last winter and well ahead any other league. League 1 is the surprise runner-up after almost multiplying investment by 5 to 153mio€. Bundesliga (99) & SerieA (87) follow, while LaLiga sides spent only 18m€
- ✓ Combined season investment by Premier League clubs was again the highest ever, in excess of 1,6bio€ (+15%). SerieA reached 751m€, followed by Bundesliga (644), LaLiga (495), and Ligue1 (343)
- ✓ Premier League sides sold players for a whopping 282m€ this winter, more than ever. SerieA (85), Bundesliga (79) complete the top 3. Ligue1 & LaLiga sides only collected 38 & 33m€ for player sales respectively
- ✓ High profile signings by PSG and investment of Olympique Marseille under new ownership made Ligue1 the strongest in Europe in terms of net investment. Premier League were only 4th, with player sales income 5m€ higher than amount spent (negative net investment)

CONCLUSIONS FTR 2017- WINTER (2 OF 4)

- ✓ PSG aspiration to improve table position made them the highest spenders in Europe (70m€), followed by Crystal Palace & Marseille (38m€) in their mission to avoid relegation and play in Europe respectively. Only 5 EPL teams feature in top 10 (vs 7 last year)
- ✓ For the third time in the last 4 years, Chelsea lead the ranking of player sales income in Europe winter after selling Oscar to Chinese side Shanghai SIPG. Benfica is once again among top teams in income after selling Guedes to PSG. For the first time, 5 EPL sides feature in European top 10 of sales income
- ✓ Draxler's signing by PSG for 40m€ is the most expensive in Europe, followed by Manchester City's Gabriel Jesus (32m€) and PSG's Guedes (30). Only 5 out of 10 most expensive signings took place in England (vs 9 last year). 9 of 10 took place either in England or France. Both Draxler and Jesus signings join historical top 10 of most expensive winter signings
- ✓ Manchester City was the side with highest combined investment (summer + winter) of season 2016/17 with 206m€, followed by Juventus (199) and city rivals ManU (185). FC Barcelona the only LaLiga side featuring in the top 10 of season 2016/17

CONCLUSIONS FTR 2017- WINTER (3 OF 4)

- ✓ LaLiga sides investment in winter was down 33% to just 18m€, following strong summer activity and lack of transfers by Madrid teams due to FIFA ban
- ✓ Including summer signings, Spanish clubs have spent 495mio€ in player transfers at season 2016/17, 3rd highest amount in LaLiga's history. FC Barcelona and Atletico were top spending teams
- ✓ Only 15 out of 45 players (33%) signed last winter participated in more than half of the minutes in the games remaining to finish the season, down from 64% last year. The performance did not reach the expectations. Just 12 out of 45 players signed last winter stayed at their teams for new season 2016/17, which confirms the search for short term contribution players
- ✓ Investment at LaLiga was concentrated in just 5 teams –Sevilla, Granada, Málaga, Celta y Betis- while the other 15 teams have not paid any transfer fees
- ✓ Montoya (5,5m€) & Lenglet (5) are most expensive signings of the winter at LaLiga, both of them were acquired by Sevilla. As usual, teams have limited their investments to very specific necessities trying to obtain loans and players with zero cost

CONCLUSIONS FTR 2017- WINTER (4 OF 4)

- ✓ LaLiga income from player sales was down 50% to 33m€, the lowest amount of top 5 European leagues, confirming the improved ability of LaLiga sides to retain best talent (amount would be just 15m€ if Villarreal would not have sold Pato to China). Besides Villarreal, only Sevilla (amount reinvested) and Celta sold players to other leagues
- ✓ A total of 42 players were signed by LaLiga sides in January, of which 80% were either on loan (29) or free transfers (5). On the other side, 48 players left their teams this winter
- ✓ Leganes was the most active LaLiga team in January, bringing 8 new players and releasing 3. Only 7 teams (including Real Madrid and Atletico) did not sign any new players this winter
- ✓ Granada and Villarreal were the teams that released the highest number of players (6 each), followed by Las Palmas and Deportivo (5 each). FC Barcelona, At. Madrid and Málaga were the only sides in LaLiga that did not release any player



SUMMARY: ON GOING SEASON REVIEW (1 OF 2)

- ✓ The use of summer signings stays similar to the previous years. 42% of the summer transfers have played more than half of the minutes. One more season the amount does not reach the 50% ratio. Valencia is the team that has taken best advantage of summer player signings. On the opposite side FC Barcelona and Real Madrid, where no players signed in the summer have played more than 50% of the minutes
- ✓ Pogba (the most expensive transfer ever) has become the most profitable player from top 10 most expensive of last summer. Mané and Higuaín are also among the most profitable. On the opposite side, Mkhitarian, Sané and Batshuayi have participated in less than 50% of the minutes
- ✓ Franco Vazquez, played a main role in Sampaoli's Sevilla, he played 74% of minutes and he become the most profitable signing from top 10 most expensive of last summer. Gaitán, Vrashljko and Alcácer the least used from those most expensive
- ✓ The defenders M. Gaspar, Víctor Ruiz and Rosales have played all the minutes in the first half. From the second year in a row, injuries have prevent Messi from being in the ranking of highest participation. Neither is Ronaldo due to the muscular pains at the beginning of the season

SUMMARY: ON GOING SEASON REVIEW (2 OF 2)

- ✓ Villarreal and R.Sociedad are the teams with the most stable line-up: 9 of their players have played more than 70% of the minutes. On the opposite side with only 3 players are Granada and Real Madrid (2 less than last year) While FC Barcelona keeps 6 key players

- ✓ Osasuna is the team who used more players until now (29). On the opposite side there is At. Madrid with only 21

- ✓ For the 4th year in a row At. Bilbao (21) is the leader in the use of home grown players. Sporting (15) and Las Palmas (14) complete the Top 3. FC Barcelona is out of the podium for the 2nd consecutive year. Eibar, Leganés and Deportivo (1) are in the last position

- ✓ Having used 10 home grown players, FC Barcelona finds itself in the first position of the European for the 2nd year in a row. They have occupied this spot 7 times in the last 8 years. Following it we find Real Madrid, Hoffenheim and PSG with 7 home grown players

SUMMARY- EUROPEAN FOOTBALL TABLE 2016/17 (1 OF 3)

- ✓ For the first time in the last 8 years, Chelsea leads the European classification having earned 85,96% of the points (highest % of an English team in the last 10 years). Followed by Juventus with (83,33%) and Bayern (82,35%) who has lead the table the previous 3 years. FC Barcelona (71,93%) falls out of the Top3 because of the weak results at Camp Nou. Real Madrid obtained 79,63% of the points and reaches the 4th spot in the European classification, improving their results from last season (7th with a 70,18%)

- ✓ Juventus and Rome are the only two teams that have won all their games at home. Chelsea has been the best team away obtaining 81,48% of the points during the first half of the season

- ✓ Monaco leads European table in terms of the most goals scored (with an average of 2,95 goals per game) followed by FC Barcelona (2,68) and Real Madrid (2,67). Monaco also leads table of goals scored at home with (3,88) the highest average in the last 4 years. FC Barcelona (2,80) and Real Madrid (2,67) lead the table of goals scored away.

- ✓ Bayern Munich has the best defense in Europe conceding only 0.59 goals per game. Only followed by Chelsea and Niza with 0,68 goals per game

SUMMARY- EUROPEAN FOOTBALL TABLE 2016/17 (2 OF 3)

- ✓ Osasuna (LaLiga), Pescara (Serie A) and Crotone (Serie A), are the worse teams in Europe

- ✓ Nantes (1,69 points per goal on average), Empoli (1,55) y Saint-Etienne (1,44) are the teams whose goals have the best performance in Europe

- ✓ For the first time in 8 years, LaLiga Santander (2,91) leads the ranking in average of scored goals after two years decreasing the average

- ✓ The Premier League with an average of 2,85 goals holds the 2nd position for the second consecutive year followed by Serie A (2,76), and Bundesliga (2,60) that falls to the 4th position after leading the ranking the last 6 years. Ligue 1 closes the Top5 with an average of 2,52

- ✓ The investment in new players has led to best results on the field only for 5 out of the 10 teams that spent the most in Spain. Sevilla, Madrid y Real Sociedad are the teams that have improved the most in comparison with last season



SUMMARY- EUROPEAN FOOTBALL TABLE 2016/17 (3 OF 3)

- ✓ Cavani (18 goals) leads the table of top scorers after the first half of the season in the 5 main European leagues. For second year in a row, neither Messi or Cristiano Ronaldo, are the leaders. In the second position we find Aubameyang with 16 goals and in the third is Leo Messi with 15 goals

- ✓ Falcao is the most efficient player in Europe, he scores a goal every 69 minutes. Followed by Cavani (1 goal every 74 minutes) and Guido Carrillo (1 every 80 minutes), all top 3 players come from the Ligue 1

- ✓ Kevin de Bruyne leads the table in assists with a total of 10 assists (smallest amount in the last 3 years) followed by Toni Kroos, Callejón and Forsberg with 9 assists each

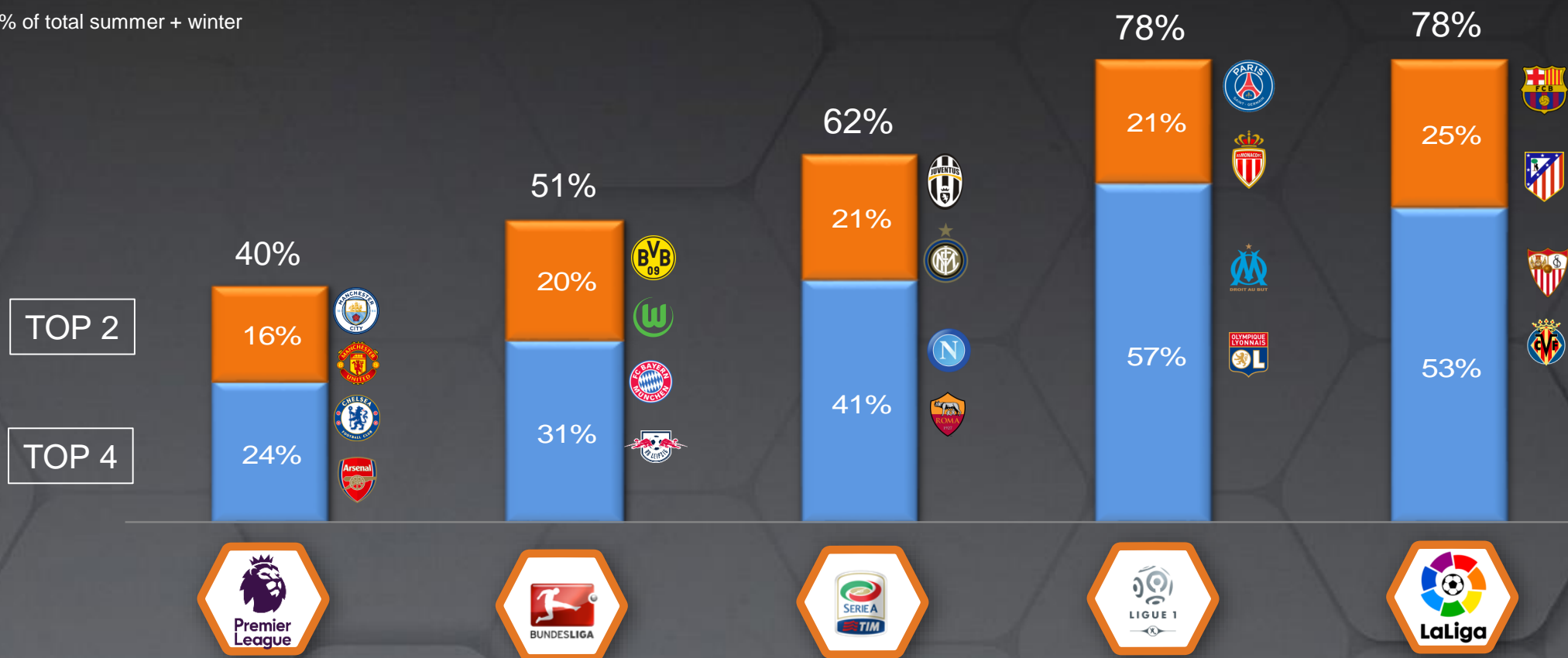


